Rabbi's Message Sept/Oct 2019

Usually, the High Holidays come in a big rush. August winds down, families return from vacation, Labor Day comes and goes, pools close, kids go off to school, activities that are often put on hold during the summer start-up again. And amidst all this flurry of activity, suddenly it is Rosh Hashanah, and we are not ready!

This year we have been given a gift. September is here, but the holidays don't start until the end of the month. That means we can experience the arrival of the holidays this year in Jewish time.

What do I mean by that? The month before Rosh Hashanah, called Elul in the Jewish calendar, was designed as time to prepare ourselves for the Holidays. Every day in Elul, a special Psalm is said, and the shofar is blown - a single blast, every day except Shabbat. The Psalm is a gentle reminder, and the shofar blast is a wake-up call - for our souls. "Get ready!", they tell us. "It's time!", they remind us. And, before we get into the flurry of cooking and preparing, we have the luxury to do what we are meant to do during this season - heshbon hanefesh, an accounting of our lives.

Are we where we want to be? Doing what we want to be doing? Are we using our days wisely? Are our relationships the best they can be? What needs to stay the same, and what needs to change? What things are under our control and what things must we simply learn to accept? And how can we tell the difference?

This is soul work, and it is not easy. But this year, we have been given a gift. The month of Elul stretches for almost the entire month of September - Jewish and secular calendars coming together in rare agreement. Use this

gift wisely. As the Talmud's Rabbi Hillel famously said, If not now, when?"

Shimmy and I wish you and your loved ones a happy, healthy, and fulfilling New Year 5780. Shana tova u'metuka (a good and sweet year),

Ask our Rabbi

Q: Why is the Amidah said two times on Shabbat morning?

A: I'll answer a question with a story. In the year 70 CE, the Romans besieged Jerusalem and destroyed the Temple which was the center of the Jewish religion of that time. How could a religion, which depended on sacrifices to God at the Temple, continue in the face of the Temple's destruction? Rabbi Yochanan ben Zakkai had a solution. His students smuggled him out of Jerusalem in a coffin, allowing him to escape the burning city, and he got permission from the Roman Emperor to settle in the town of Yavne, which he founded as a center of Jewish study. The Sages of Yavne were faced with the need to preserve a Judaism that had lost its Temple. They did this by creating a service that substituted prayer for sacrifice. The recitation of the Amidah became the substitute for each sacrificial service. Every day, in Temple times, there was a daily burnt-offering in the morning, which corresponds to the Amidah that we say every morning including on Shabbat, during the Shacharit (morning) service. But on Shabbat, there was a special additional offering, "a burnt offering for every Shabbat, in addition to the regular burntoffering." (Numbers 28:10). This has become the Musaf Amidah that we recite each Shabbat after the Torah is returned to the ark. (The word "Musaf" means "additional"). And so, the Musaf Amidah provides another way for us to connect to the earliest traditions of our ancestors.
